TRAINING INFORMATION SHEET WASTE 24 SUPPORT DOCUMENT

This WISH information document is aimed at health and safety improvements in the waste management industry. The Health and Safety Executive provided support to WISH in producing this guidance. This guidance may go further than the minimum you need to do to comply with the law with regard to health and safety

This information sheet is one of a series of supporting documents to WASTE 24 (Working on the Public Highway Street Cleaning). It should be read in conjunction with WASTE 24. This sheet covers training. The other support sheets cover PPE, risk assessment, signage, vehicles, and monitoring.

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1. Introduction and scope

Those involved in setting out, maintaining, and removing traffic management systems are particularly at risk as they work on or near to a live traffic environment. In addition to highway legislation such as the New Roads and Street Works Act 1991 (NRSWA), The Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002 (TSRGD), clients and their agents, designers, contractors, and workers need to ensure that they comply with their duties under health and safety law to safeguard employees, road users and members of the public.

The principles of traffic controls are set out in the Safety at Street Works and Road Works: Code of Practice 2013 commonly known as the red book. Working in line with the code of practice will assist you in your legal obligations and duty of care whilst establishing, altering, maintaining, and removing temporary traffic management systems.

The National Highway Sector Schemes (NHSS) is the accrediting body which is recognised by National Highways, Transport Scotland, Welsh Assembly and Transport NI on their rural and urban road networks. NHSSs are primarily designed as complementary standards to ISO 9001 for organisations working on or near to the UK's road-network.

The NRSWA requires a qualified operative on site at all times whilst temporary traffic management systems are being established, altered, maintained, or removed. There are a number of training providers accredited to the NHSS.

Appendix 1 of this information sheet shows an example of the accredited training courses provided by Lantra NHSS Scheme 12.
